Serving on the board is a rewarding experience and an opportunity for personal and professional growth. This application will be kept confidential. Applications are used by the Board to identify and evaluate potential board candidates. All new directors are elected by a majority vote of current board members at an annual meeting or when a vacancy arises.

BOARD MEMBER RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Serves a minimum of one (1) two-year term on the Board. No more than three (3) consecutive full (2) two-year terms or eight (8) consecutive years in office.
2. Attends the board of directors meeting each month, in addition to special meetings and possible committee meetings. Meetings may be in person, via conference call or video call. *The Full Board of Directors meets the 1st Monday of every month from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m.*
3. Regularly checks email and is available for phone consultation if needed.
4. Stays informed about board matters, is prepared for meetings, reviews and comments on minutes, reports, and email discussions.
5. Actively engages in fundraising for the organization in whatever way best suits you.
6. Participates in the board and committee's annual evaluation, planning efforts, and goal setting.
7. Actively promotes Prairie Flower Children's Center, encourages and supports employees and volunteers, and works in the best interests of the organization (e.g. staff occasional event booths, help out at yearly festivals as able).
8. Maintains confidentiality as defined by the organization policies and laws of Iowa.
